



JONES VARGAS FEATURED ON SLATE.COM

Jones Vargas attorneys Bradley Schrager and Tracy DiFillippo were prominently featured in the online magazine, Slate.com, during the hotly-contested Nevada Democratic Caucus. The Nevada State Education Association challenged the caucus rules in court, and the Democratic National Committee (DNC) sought to intervene to defend the rules. The DNC contacted Mr. Schrager, who has assisted in drafting the caucus rules, and he and Ms. DiFillippo filed papers on behalf of the organization. Mr. Schrager successfully argued the matter in court and U.S. District Court Judge James Mahan allowed the DNC to intervene and ultimately, upheld the rules as written.
